President and Chief Executive Officer

1997 to Present

Children's Memorial Medical Center is the parent of the Children's Memorial Hospital, 270 beds, the pediatric training center for Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. The Hospital supports 150 residents and fellows in all pediatric medical and surgical specialties and sub-specialties and has been recognized as one of the top children's hospitals in the nation, according to an annual physician poll published by *U.S. News & World Report*.

Other affiliates include Children's Memorial Research Center, the research arm of the Medical Center and the designated Pediatric Research Center for Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. Other affiliates include Children's Memorial Foundation, Focused Health Solutions, Inc., a disease state management company and for-profit subsidiary, and Park West Realty Corporation, a real estate holding company.

The Medical Center has a consolidated operating budget of \$350,000,000, with faculty comprised of approximately 250 physicians and surgeons and voluntary faculty of 800 community-based pediatricians and pediatric specialists. The system employs more than 4,000 and provides virtually all pediatric, primary, secondary and tertiary services.

Representative Accomplishments include:

- Led the hospital to a \$30 million turnaround, increasing the number of children served by nearly 50 percent.
- Presided over the most successful fundraising campaign in the medical center's history, the five-year Hand in Hand campaign which raised more than \$137 million.
- Children's Memorial, the first children's hospital in the nation, was designated as a Magnet Hospital by the American Nurses Credentialing Center.
- From 1998 to 2004, saw employee satisfaction increase by 15 percent, 21.2 percent higher than the national norm, while employee turnover dropped by 14 percent.
- Led the planning and implementation of a five-year strategic plan for the expansion of the Children's Memorial Research Center, one of only a handful of institutes in the nation dedicated solely to pediatric research, and a tripling of funding from the National Institutes of Health.
- Developed a wide range of regional facilities to distribute Children's Memorial Hospital and physician services. These sites include a freestanding pediatric surgical center, four pediatric specialty ambulatory centers, an academic primary care center and the medical management of numerous nurseries and inpatient pediatric units.
- Charged by the Board of Directors with the replacement of Children's Memorial Hospital to a new \$750 million facility to be completed by 2012. He will lead a \$400 million fundraising campaign to support the new facility and its programs.

Executive Vice President, Chief Strategic Officer

1993 - 1997

Executive responsibility for providing direction for the external activities of the Children's Memorial Medical Center including the identification and implementation of strategic initiatives, and the articulation of objectives to external constituencies. Directed the activities of Corporate Planning, Marketing, Public Affairs, Patient Care Services, Physician Services, Managed Care, and Government and Community Affairs.

Representative Accomplishments Include:

- Provided executive leadership for the development of bilateral agreements with each of the Northwestern HealthCare hospitals, which positioned Children's Memorial Medical Center and its medical staff in a leadership role in the delivery of pediatric health care services within the Network.
- Established an institutional commitment to effective strategic planning involving the Board, Medical Staff and Administration that resulted in a Medical Center strategic plan.
- Assisted in the development of a community-based independent physician association to secure the Hospital's primary care physician base.

Vice President, Ambulatory and Satellite Services

1990 - 1993

Responsible for the development and implementation of an integrated pediatric health delivery system to expand the Medical Center's sphere of influence in the greater metropolitan area. Activities to support this goal included the placement of subspecialty physician practices in select suburban markets, the development of freestanding ambulatory surgical treatment centers and the provision of in-house physician coverage in the neonatal and pediatric units of select suburban hospitals.

Representative Accomplishments Include:

- Development of the Children's Memorial Specialty Pediatric Center, a \$6.8 million dollar facility equipped with three operating rooms, diagnostic and treatment facility and physician offices.
- Initiated pediatric consulting and neonatal service agreements at Northwest Community Hospital, which increased the Medical Center's market share by 2 percentage points.
